OEEN Oversight Committee

- New process to help ODE manage the OEEN
- Committee includes representatives from ODE, MCOEEN, ITC's, districts, and community schools
- Working on several initiatives:
 - Continuous improvement plan process
 - Site visits
 - Subsidy distribution formulas
 - Core services

Ohio K-12 Network

- Currently Upgrading the network
- Migrating from ATM to IP for video
 - Over six times faster
 - 50% completed for 30 sites
 - Target for completion is Sept 1, 2008
 - Remember – State support for legacy ATM video ends on Sept 1st

Ohio K-12 Network and MC-TSG

- Adding a second Internet connection
- Soon to have two locations: Columbus and Cleveland
- Double the existing Internet capacity
- Redundancy/backup – connect to different cities (New York and Chicago)
- Renegotiated pricing with the supplier
 - Higher volume => lower per unit cost

Ohio K-12 Network and MC-TSG

■ Security Audit

- State is sponsoring a security audit
- Currently in process for all 30 sites
- To be completed by the end of May
- Two phases: security testing and personnel interviews
- Will provide each site with a report of their baseline security posture

Ohio K-12 Network and MC-TSG

■ Disaster Recovery Site

- Moving forward to develop a centralized DR site that can be shared by all ITC's and ODE
- Promoting VMware and uniform hardware to make recovery faster
- Utilize the high-speed fiber backbone to facilitate off-site data storage

eTech Ohio: State Conference

- Recently held the 10th annual State Educational Technology Conference
- Over 6400 attendees
- Over 450 presentations and displays
- Keynotes and Featured Speakers included:

eTech Ohio: Commission

- Will be looking for a new director
- Currently working on strategic plan
- Chancellor Fingerhut would like to align this plan with the strategic plan for the Board of Regents

EMIS Redesign

- Part of a federal Longitudinal Data Grant
- State has awarded the contract for the EMIS redesign to IBM and EduStructures
- Will develop new methods for “vertical reporting” – the link between ITC’s and ODE
- Will incorporate SIF (School Interoperability Framework) in the data transfer model

EMIS Redesign

EMIS Redesign Requirements include:

- Design, build, and implement a new reporting infrastructure
- SIF (Schools Interoperability Framework) for SSID and data transfer
- SIF agents for eSIS and DASL
- Training to enable ITC's to support SIF
- New state data warehouse to improve access and reporting
- Converting data from 2003 to present

EMIS Advisory Committee

- Alternating chair
 - This year it is Sen Joy Padgett, Chm of the Senate Education Committee
- Discussing several issues
 - Clarifying the role of the committee
 - Professional Development
 - Clarifying tasks regarding EMIS data entry
 - Cost of EMIS
 - EMIS Coordinator standards/certification
 - Summer 2008 reporting dates

INFOhio

- Recently relocated main office
 - 2455 North Star Road, Suite 1, Columbus 43221
 - Phone, fax and e-mail addresses will remain the same.
- Other activities
 - Working with Libraries Connect Task Force to determine titles for online access in FY 09

ODE vs Governor

- Ted Strickland announced his plans in his State of the State address:
 - Recommending a cabinet-level position to oversee K-12 Education
 - State Supt of Schools and State Board of Education would remain in advisory capacity
- Not gaining much support from educational community or the State Board
- Might get political 😊

Other ODE Concerns

- Recent departures
- Hiring freeze
- Budget cuts
- Will the issues with the Governor force other internal changes?

State Budget: Recent Cuts

- Governor announced cuts to counter reduction in revenue
- Impact to OEEN Line 200-426:
 - \$1,318,696 in fiscal year 2008
 - \$1,470,551 in fiscal year 2009
 - Cuts allocated to Ohio K-12 Network
- Impact to EMIS Line 200-446:
 - Cut the proposed increase for FY 09

State Budget: Recent Cuts

- Impact for the OEEN and EMIS?
 - Tried to hold ITC's and schools harmless
 - EMIS is flat funded – no change in the amount of state subsidy to support EMIS
 - No increase for ITC and INFOhio state support
 - K-12 Network will delay some projects planned to upgrade the network
 - Will not effect the \$3000 per building subsidy or state support for Internet access
- If more cuts... all bets are off

State Budget: FY 10 and FY 11

- State Board has advanced the timeline for their proposed educational budget
- No expectations for any increased support for “infrastructure” items like OEEN
- Recession fears – things are not looking good
- Governor is currently “fishing” several ideas and has pledged to come up with a school funding plan in 2009.

D3A2 Statistics

- 126 Schools with EMIS data loaded
 - *Up from 116 in the previous month*
- 70 districts have test data loaded
 - *Up from 60 in the previous month*
- 5,497 Data Warehouse user accounts
 - *Up from 2,923 in the previous month*

D3A2 Activities

- The project is growing as more schools load data into the data warehouse
- Project to add short-term assessments has been delayed. Steering Committee is trying to revive this plan
- Rebuilt the Financial Resources Committee
- Looking for ways to support D3A2 moving forward
